

David Rudling is Senior Lecturer in Archaeology at the Centre for Community Engagement at the University of Sussex. He was previously the Director of the UCL Field Archaeology Unit and its commercial division, Archaeology South-East. Whilst at the Field Unit David undertook various excavations at Winchelsea between 1976 and 1982. In 2004 he and David Martin published reports on the various excavations in Winchelsea up to 2000. David's current main research interests include: romanisation in Sussex during the Late Iron Age and Roman periods, Roman rural settlements and land-use, religion and ritual in Roman Britain, as well as multi-period landscape archaeology and ancient and medieval numismatics.
